Quote: I am pleased to advise that we will soon begin the Annual Medical Assessment (AMA) pilot with Christchurch-based Vietnam veterans.

The objective of the pilot is to help ensure that veterans (and their GPs) are monitoring their health. We want to encourage veterans to make an appointment for a medical assessment each year and to make it easy for GPs to complete the assessment and for that information to be passed quickly and accurately onto Veterans' Affairs for any support that might be required.

Thirteen Vietnam Veterans and their GP practices have signed up for the pilot. Veterans' Affairs will fund a one-hour appointment for this assessment. Practices will also schedule the next annual assessment as part of the appointment.

During the assessment, the GP will fill in the AMA form online. It is hosted by Heathlink and is similar to the ACC forms that GPs are familiar with. This means that the GP doesn't have to manually complete the form and it also integrates with the GP's patient management system.

Dr. Mike O'Reilly, VA Principal Clinical Advisor, will be the liaison person for the pilot. Once the pilot is completed and if all goes well, we will be looking to expand the pilot for further testing.

We hope that this pilot will demonstrate that the new AMA system will improve Veteran access to GPs and improve their GPs' understanding of their conditions. We also expect it to expedite access to support from Veterans' Affairs and if required, to appropriate treatments.

I will update you in 2023 with the outcome of the pilot.

The review is important to make sure future investments are fit-for-purpose in a dynamic security environment, with a Pacific region grappling with climate change and the intensification of strategic competition.

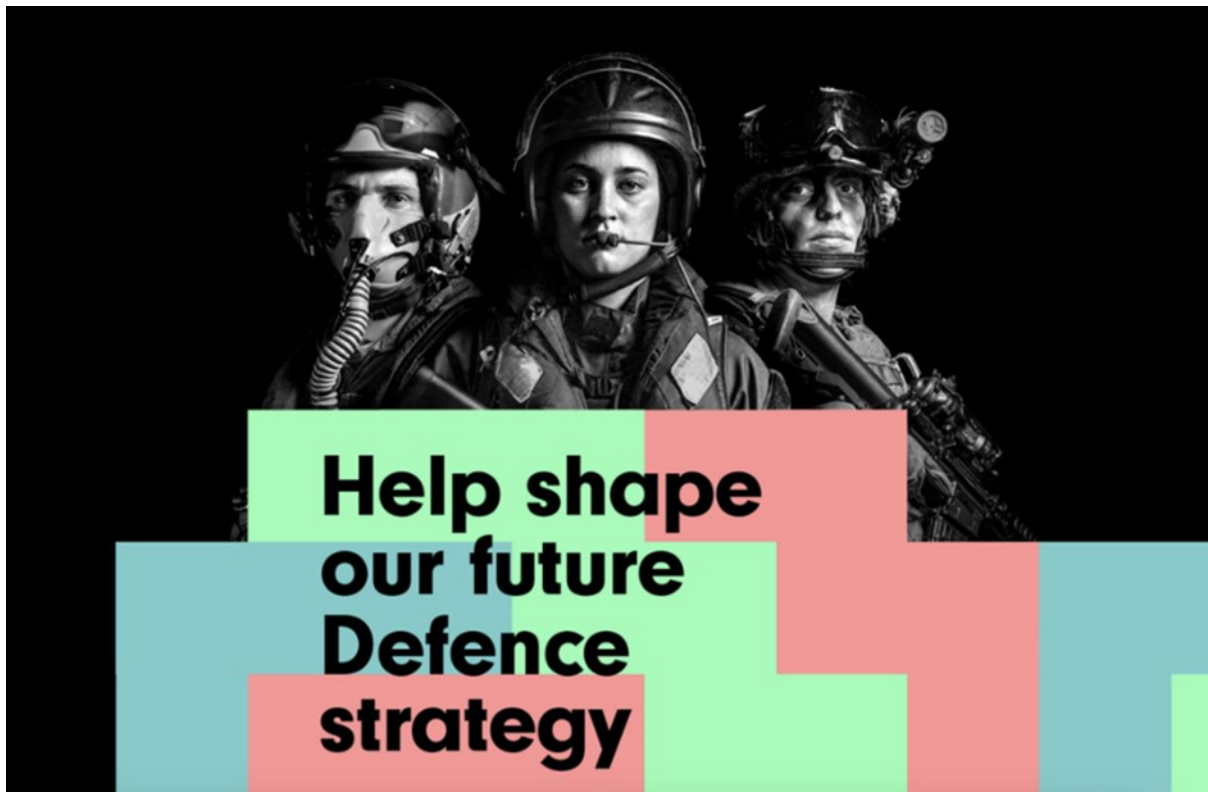

If you have the slightest inclination that something is not right, you're probably right. Activate the 'delete' key immediately

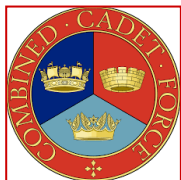
Again, If you don't recognise the sender, activate the 'delete' key immediately.

Hi, my name is Isabella Noble and I am the granddaughter of the late LCpl Cecil Richard Fisk.

I am 13 1/2 years old and live in the UK. I am very proud of my grandad and have always had an interest in the army and outdoor activities.

I joined an after school club when I was 10 years old called YETI. This club involves outdoor activities ie. Canoeing, rock climbing, outdoor survival. YETI is the lead up to joining the Cadets when you are 12 years old.

I absolutely loved this club and was excited to join the CCF (Combined Cadet Force sponsored by the MOD) when I turned 12!

We are lucky enough to have the CCF at my school, so every Tuesday I have to go to school in full army uniform and then attend CCF after school till 6pm.



We get to do so many fun activities outdoors in all weather. My absolute favourite is shooting and I am now on the shooting team!

We have to learn drills and turnout, skill at arms, shooting, map and compass, field craft and first aid. I have also been lucky enough to enrol in the Duke of Edinburgh Award - Bronze.

There are 3 stages to achieve this award.

1. 3 months of volunteering - I have chosen to volunteer in the Cadets Store and I have to do this twice a week in my lunchtime.

For your information this gathering has been recognised as a Veterans Reunion by VANZ, so those with Qualifying Overseas Service can access \$2500 of the Commemorative Travel Fund for accommodation and flights by furnishing receipts in your application to VANZ.
